

ANNEX 1: ON NIGERIA 2.0 MEDIA MONITORING METHODOLOGY (LEARNING BRIEF)



Background

Under On Nigeria 1.0, EnCompass subcontracted Playspread, based in Nigeria, and Pulsar TRAC, a media monitoring software company, to monitor various media sources (print, radio, television (TV), online, and social media), using filters, keywords, sub-keywords, and hashtags related to On Nigeria 1.0's modules to identify and pull corruption-related articles, segments, and posts. These articles, along with corruption-related articles produced and/or supported and submitted by Media and Journalism (MJ) grantees, comprised the full media monitoring dataset during On Nigeria 1.0. EnCompass sorted each article from the digital media data stream into one of six categories: Investigative; News Story – Potentially Investigative (also referred to as Potentially Investigative); News Story – News; News Story – Feature; Op Ed/Editorial; and Press Release/Speech, and then assessed the quality of Investigative and Potentially Investigative articles according to a quality rubric comprised of five domains: Source Variety; Research Quality; Neutrality; Originality; and Public Interest.

After a strategy review in 2019 and 2020, the Program Team worked with EnCompass to revise the On Nigeria theory of change (TOC) and develop an EL Framework for On Nigeria 2.0. EnCompass then updated the media monitoring methodology to better align with the revised TOC and EL Framework. This document summarizes that updated methodology and explains how it differs from the methods used under On Nigeria 1.0.

Media Monitoring 2.0 Methodology

Overview

Media monitoring assesses the level of media coverage related to corruption issues and anticorruption actions, including the frequency with which the work of On Nigeria grantees is mentioned in the media. The revised media monitoring methodology comprises three data streams:

traditional media, digital media, and social media. In the aggregate, these data streams enable EnCompass, in partnership with subcontractors Playspread and Pulsar, to measure the quantity of corruption-related reporting on different topics across the media and social media landscape, and assess the quality of investigative journalism in Nigeria. Each year, data is collected in five languages, as noted below, and translated into English for analysis. For the purposes of [Learning Brief #6- Media Monitoring 2021 Report](#), only digital and traditional media were analyzed. Social media will be analyzed in [Learning Brief #5- Amplifying Investigative Journalism](#).

Data streams

Traditional media

The traditional media data stream captures TV and radio segments in English, Hausa, Yoruba, Igbo, and Pidgin. EnCompass developed a list of criteria to purposively sample traditional media consisting of Nigerian radio and TV sources based on the reach, popularity, corruption-related reporting, and reputation of each source. A variety of news sources that met these criteria were then selected based on the diversity of languages, with a minimum of two news sources selected for each language. The regional coverage for each news source ensures the sample covers all major regions of Nigeria.

Traditional media sources inclusion criteria include:

- National, regional, and state-level reach, measured by viewership
- Popularity at national, regional, and state levels
- Coverage of corruption-related news reporting
- Reputation as a quality radio and TV source
- Diversity of Nigerian languages
- On Nigeria 2.0 grantee organizations partnered with radio and TV sources

A total of nine national, regional, and state-level TV channels were selected for their strong penetration nationally as well as in the North Central, North East, North West, South West, South East, and South South regions of Nigeria. Five of the TV channels are nationally broadcast, while four of the TV channels are regionally focused.

The 11 radio stations include one national station and ten stations with regional and state focus. Three stations are government sponsored: Rhythm FM, KSMC Kaduna, and Rock City FM. One station, Wazobia FM Lagos, has a wide reach and is in Pidgin, thereby popular with southern populations. Radio stations vary in terms of focus – from world news, investigative news, politics, and talk radio.

The 20 traditional media sources produce four breaking news segments each day and are aired in the morning, afternoon, later afternoon, and evening. The most watched TV segment and the most listened to radio segment were in the evenings, therefore one hour of breaking news was sampled

daily from each TV channel and radio station during the evening hour.¹ TV and radio data for 2021 was retroactively recorded, transcribed, and translated into English (in the cases where segments were in Igbo, Pidgin, Hausa, or Yoruba) (**Exhibit 1**).

Corruption-related filter terms: A list of 26 filter terms were developed to capture all corruption-related news from traditional media sources. Boolean search operators were applied to each filter term along with variations of the terms to ensure different and accurate usage of the word was captured from the TV and radio segments. For the list of corruption-related filter terms, please see **Exhibit 4** below.

Module-specific keywords: The module-specific keywords and phrases have been organized by the On Nigeria 2.0 modules—Criminal Justice, Joinbodi, Media and Journalism, and Behavior Change. Each of the keywords for the modules are based on the topics relating to the work conducted in the corruption space or specific grantee-related efforts that fall under the topic of the module. The cross-cutting category consists of concepts that overlap for more than one of the four modules. Some of the keywords in the cross-cutting category were also too broad to be included in the corruption-related filter terms since it may capture data that may be irrelevant to corruption (**Exhibits 5-9**).

Sampling: Playspread followed a step-by-step process to collect, crawl, screen, analyze, and report traditional media data by first recording, transcribing, and translating (in the case of non-English segments) all TV and radio segments during the evening hour. Then Playspread searched all transcribed segments for the corruption-related filter terms and collected only segments containing these words. Finally, the module-specific keywords were applied to the remaining segments through tags so that the keyword mentioned could be calculated (**Exhibit 10**).

Cleaning: The EnCompass team cleaned the data so that each segment with all corruption-related filter terms and all associated module-specific keywords appeared in one row. Following this, the EnCompass team was able to complete descriptive statistics to analyze the different filter terms, keywords, modules, and grantee organizations mentioned in the segments.

Digital media

EnCompass developed a list of criteria to purposively sample online Nigerian sources based on the reach, popularity, corruption-related news reporting, and reputation of each online source. The regional coverage for each online source ensures the sample covers all major regions of Nigeria.

Digital media inclusion criteria:

- National, regional, and state-level reach, measured by readership
- Popularity at national, regional, and state levels
- Coverage of corruption-related online reporting
- Reputation as a quality online source

A total of 15 online sources were selected for their national and regional audiences. Five of the online sources are On Nigeria 2.0 MJ grantee organizations (see sources marked with an * in **Exhibit 2**), while ten of the online sources are reputable, non-grantee sources. All sources have a focus on news reporting with some sources having a specific investigative journalism column on their websites, such as Premium Times. National and regional news sources are listed in **Exhibit 2** along with their rank by website traffic among Nigerian online news sources according to SimilarWeb.com as of June 2022.

Corruption-related filter terms: A list of 26 filter terms and phrases were provided to capture all corruption-related articles from online media sources. Boolean search operators were applied to each filter term or phrase along with variations of the keywords to ensure different and accurate usage of the word was captured. Online news data from Pulsar TRAC was collected retroactively for the last 12 months from the start date. For the list of corruption-related filter terms, please see **Exhibit 4** below.

Module-specific keywords: The module-specific keywords and phrases have been organized by the On Nigeria 2.0 modules—Criminal Justice, Joinbodi, Media and Journalism, and Behavior Change. Each of the keywords for the modules are based on the topics relating to the work done in the corruption space or specific grantee-related efforts that fall under the topic of the module. The cross-cutting category consists of concepts that overlap for more than one of the four modules. Some of the keywords in the cross-cutting category were also too broad to be included in the corruption-related filter terms since it may capture data that may be irrelevant to corruption (**Exhibits 5-9**).

Sampling: Encompass input the corruption-related filter terms on Pulsar TRAC to capture all corruption-related online news in Nigeria. With the support of the Pulsar team, a tag was developed on the Pulsar TRAC platform for each corruption-related filter term and module-level keyword. All articles were then exported and downloaded as an excel sheet.

Cleaning: The Encompass team cleaned the digital media data by extracting the purposive sample of 15 media organizations from the larger sample. The data was further cleaned so that each tag appeared in a separate column, at which point descriptive statistics could be performed similarly to the traditional media monitoring methodology.

Investigative Reporting (sub-stream of digital media)

Due to the updated sampling methodology for On Nigeria 2.0, far more corruption-related online articles were collected for 2021 than in past years. For this reason, EnCompass selected an equal sample of online articles to assess the quality of investigative journalism. A total of 2,000 articles were randomly sampled with 1,000 articles selected from grantee media organizations and 1,000 articles selected from non-grantee media organizations. At the start of the Media Monitoring 2.0 Methodology, Playspread classified articles into either investigative or non-investigate articles (see **Annex 2** for detailed descriptions of the article categorization process). The investigative articles were then assessed for quality against a rubric (see **Annex 2** for the Quality of Investigative Reporting rubric).

Social media

Annex 1 will be updated to include more details on the social media monitoring methodology during the delivery of [Learning Brief #5- Amplifying Investigative Journalism](#).

Key Differences Between 1.0 and 2.0

Exhibit 3 summarizes key differences between the On Nigeria 1.0 Media Monitoring Methodology and the On Nigeria 2.0 Media Monitoring Methodology.
